I am delighted to announce and invite everyone to the new ESO Conference that will be held in Glasgow from 17-19 April, 2015. The new conference will be run under the auspices of ESO, will have a democratic approach to its organisation and will be financially transparent. Any modest profit, and we aim only for this, will be controlled entirely by ESO and used for ESO's proven educational, political and scientific activities such as the development of European Guidelines, Summer School, Winter School, Stroke Masters, Stroke Science Workshop and Department to Department visits. It will be organised by a strong team, since ESO members and fellows have a long history as the principal scientific leaders, chair people and presenters at past ESCs.

Over coming months, we will communicate directly with our colleagues across the world to explain, if this should still be necessary, the reasons for the new conference. Meantime, please recognise that the decision was taken at a General Assembly that was held in the largest available hall in Nice, and yet still had insufficient space to accommodate every member. Some could vote only from the adjacent corridor and yet there was absolute unanimity on the separation from ESC that had been forced on ESO.

Moving forward, everyone was delighted by the unprecedented number of nominations and the huge representation in the elections for committee positions. We welcome our new democratically appointed representatives:
